A Family Intervention to Reduce Teen Suicide in Uganda. **July 30, 2025**
 Led a two-day teen suicide prevention training workshop in Western Uganda in which 38 mental health professionals were trained in Attachment-Based Family Therapy (ABFT), a family-based EBP for teen suicide. We also explored cultural beliefs about suicide, promoted the idea of engaging caregivers in prevention efforts. [Link to article](#). Building Capacity to Implement Emotionally Focused Therapy in Africa **2023- To date**
 In partnership with a California-based nonprofit, Conexa International, I lead cross-cultural collaborative efforts to expand Emotionally Focused Couple Therapy (EFCT) into African contexts, where research and training remain limited. Together with colleagues from North America, South Africa, and across Africa, we have organized three major EFCT training workshops. In 2023, we trained 120 Ugandan professionals, followed by 122 in Kenya (2024) and 75 in Zimbabwe in 2025. We are conducting ongoing evaluation research to assess EFCT's cultural fit and feasibility before large-scale trials, with discussions underway to extend training to Ethiopia.
